# REFLECTION – 29 June Feast of SS Peter and Paul

Two of the greatest saints who have ever lived are commemorated together on this Feast. Simon Peter, the acknowledged disciples leader of Christ's and impetuously inclined 'Prince of Apostles' is joined by a man who was, in so many respects, his polar opposite: Saul of Tarsus, a fiercely observant Pharisee, scholar and one of the most creative and



original theologians to ever live, who became St Paul. We join with the Church through the ages in honouring two of the 'Apostolic men' who gave the Church its initial missionary impetus and zeal. They were both very different!

As we celebrate these two great saints, let us remind ourselves that, although very different, each had a personality which contributed much to the Church. In the same way, provided we allow God to work with us and through us, our own personality makes a vital contribution of itself, quite apart from any specific gifts with which we might be endowed. Let us celebrate the great diversity with which God endows the members of his Church as we rejoice in the examples of his great saints.

### The Carnegie special

Years 7 and 9 have been shadowing the Yoto Carnegie Book Awards.

Both Writing awards went to verse novels

The Shadowers' Award for Writing (voted for by pupils nationally) went

to <u>Crossing the Line</u> by Tia Fisher. This powerful novel looks at how one boy gets sucked into carrying drugs for a gang, one bad decision at a time. To strengthen its message, Tia plays with text and the formatting of its lines. Year 10+

The Yoto Carnegie Medal for Writing was won by Joseph Coelho, the current Children's Laureate for <u>The Boy Lost in the Maze</u>. This brilliantly weaves the stories of Theseus in ancient Greece and modern day Theo's very personal journey to find their fathers. It speaks to a profound need to know where you come from to know where you are going. I found the poetry deeply moving. I recommend this book to deep thinkers everywhere. Year 10+

Both awards for Illustration were won by <u>The Tree and the River</u> by Aaron Becker, meaning that this book appealed to both the judging committee and the nation's children. The story is told entirely without words.

Our year 7 Shadowing group has really enjoyed following the Carnegie awards this year. "I loved doing the club and trying the challenges and would recommend for next year's Year 7's" – Emi "Being in a book club and talking about illustrations was a really fun experience, It helped me to appreciate all the hard work and attention to detail that goes into every book. ### SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Police are urging parents to check the group WhatsApp settings on their children's phones after a number of 11 year olds in Gloucestershire were exposed to sexual violence and racist content.

Officers have received reports that children in the county have been automatically added to a group without their knowledge or permission.

Once in the group, which has an American phone number prefix, they are encouraged to add everyone in their contacts and are then sent upsetting sexually violent and racist content.

Group members are then warned that if they leave the chat, they will be found.

Police are now asking parents whose children use WhatsApp to check the settings on the messaging app so that they cannot be added to groups by unknown third parties. The default setting in WhatsApp allows anyone to add a number to a group chat without needing permission.

To disable this, go to WhatsApp and follow these steps:

Go to Settings

- > Privacy
- > Groups
- > Under 'who can add me to groups', select 'My contacts'

Parents are also advised to talk to their children and advise them not to view the chat if they have been added to the group and to block, delete and report the group to WhatsApp immediately.

### FREE SCHOOL MEAL HOLIDAY VOUCHERS

We are writing to give you an update on the Household Support Fund which Bristol City Council currently receives from the government. A large proportion of this is used to provide supermarket vouchers for the families of eligible free school meal pupils during holiday periods.

In March 2024, the government made the decision to extend the Household Support Fund until September 2024.

Last week, Bristol City Council's Strategy and Resources committee agreed to use the fund to award grants of £45 per pupil in receipt of free school meals for the upcoming summer holiday period. These will be distributed in the form supermarket voucher by our finance team as in previous holiday periods.

Bristol City Council's Strategy and Resources committee have recognised that this is a reduced rate compared to previous years due to the limited six-month extension.

We understand that this may cause real challenges for families over the school holidays. If you know someone who is struggling, there is further information and support on the council's dedicated <u>cost of living webpage</u>. The 'We Are Bristol' phoneline is also available on 0800 694 0184 between 8.30am to 5pm, Monday to Friday.

We do not yet know details about the future of the Household Support Fund beyond September 2024 when the fund is expected to end. This will be decided by the future government after the general election on Thursday 4 July and we will update you with more information as soon as we are able to.
