

Pope John Paul II was the head of the Catholic Church from 16 October 1978 to his death in 2005. He was the second longest-serving pope in history. As a Pole, he was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years.

He travelled more than any other pope before him, visiting many of the countries of the world. He is also famous for starting the annual World Youth Day.



John Paul II was canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014 which means that the Polish Pope is now known as **Saint John Paul II**.


YEAR 7 ADMISSIONS SEPTEMBER 2025

Parents/carers of any Year 6 children (born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014) wishing to join St Bede's Catholic College are reminded that now is the time to apply for their secondary school place for September 2025. To make an application:

- 1. You must complete the secondary transfer application form provided by your home Local Authority (available on the LA website) by **31 October 2024**, and:
- 2. If you are applying for a baptised Catholic child or for child of another faith denomination, you should also complete a Supplementary Information Form (available on our website) and provide a copy of your child's baptism certificate/proof of membership, also by **31 October 2024**.

Well done to all who participated. Students and staff had so much fun and all for a worthy cause raising a wonderful £560.17!












LIBRARY NEWS

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Important notice:

A reminder for all parents and carers - Child feeling unwell?

Please discuss with your son or daughter the importance of following the correct procedure in the unusual event of feeling unwell in college.

Students who are not feeling well must alert a member of staff who will notify student support to assist.

Under no circumstances should a student attempt to use their own methods to speak directly to a parent or carer.

College staff will medically assess the student and make a decision whether to call an emergency contact parent/carer or not.

If a student needs to leave the college due to illness, they are not permitted to do so alone.

Children must be collected by a named person, verified by details on the college administration system.

RAISING MONEY FOR SANDRA

Lillian, year 13 would like to share her story:

Many of you may remember Areté student Sandra from lower school and year 12. She is an incredible person who excelled in her studies and creative arts.

However, on the 17th of June, we were saddened to hear that she was diagnosed with a brain tumour. It was an aggressive form of brain cancer. She underwent brain surgery, which left her with significant challenges. The surgery impacted her ability to walk, her speech, the use of her right hand, and her cognitive ability particularly her short term memory. This has made learning and daily tasks much more challenging.

Despite these challenges, she remains determined to finish her A-Levels and further education. The road to recovery is long and requires intense speech, physiotherapy and other support services. Her 18th Birthday will mark the start of chemotherapy, another battle she must face with courage and resilience.

Thank you for taking the time to read Sandra's story and for any support you can provide. Together, we can help give her the chance to return to her life, and the chance to chase her dreams once again.

#LetGirlsPlay Football Festival










