YEAR 7 GIRLS' PE

This term, our Year 7 girls have been making incredible progress through net games like short tennis and table tennis. These activities have provided a fun and supportive environment where pupils are building Meaningful Experiences (ME) in coordination, mastering new skills, and improving their shot selection.

Coordination is a vital skill that underpins nearly every physical activity we do. Whether threading a needle,



driving a car, or playing sports, coordination allows us to perform movements smoothly and efficiently. It's also key to developing motor skills, reaction times, and balance. Beyond physical activities, good coordination boosts cognitive functioning, helping with problem-solving, multitasking, and even emotional regulation.

By practicing net games, pupils strengthen hand-eye coordination, spatial awareness, and timing, all of which transfer to daily tasks, fostering confidence and competence in life's challenges.

It's been a pleasure to see the Year 7 girls embrace net games with such enthusiasm and determination. Their progress on and off the court highlights the power of Physical Education in shaping confident, capable individuals.

We're proud of the effort they've put in this term-keep it up, Year 7 girls!

ST BEDE'S HAS RECRUITED A GROUP OF GIRLS FOOTBALL ACTIVATORS

St. Bede's is excited to be working with a small group of Year 9 and 10 girls in a 'Go Lead' football leadership programme. This programme is designed to help secondary schools create engaging, meaningful and enjoyable football opportunities for girls through the power of girls football activators.

The participants will take part in a variety of workshops to become competent girls' football activists, enabling them to design, create and deliver football activities both within our college and at local primary schools.

On Tuesday 14th January, the girls participated in the 'INSPIRE' launch workshop online, where they discussed their mission and vision for the academic year.

Their first event will take place in March, involving primary schools coming to St. Bede's Catholic College for the LetGirlsPlay biggest football session, where they will take on roles as coaches and officials during this event.

FUTURE QUEST YEAR 12 FUTURE EXPLORER LAW WORKSHOP

On Friday 17th January a group of Year 12 Law students visited the University of the West of England to participate in an engaging and interactive Law workshop. The day began with students observing a simulated courtroom case, which provided valuable insight into how legal proceedings unfold.

Following this, they took part in a hands-on mock trial based on a provided scenario. To prepare, students engaged in lively debates, developing their arguments and sharpening their critical thinking skills.

Taking on the roles of either the defence or prosecution, they explored and applied the complexities of law and justice in a dynamic and thought-provoking manner. The workshop was an enriching experience, offering students a deeper understanding of the legal system and a glimpse into what it's like to study and practice law.

CASHLESS CATERING ARREARS

Although it is not something we like to see, we have a number of students whose accounts go into arrears on a regular basis. We generally email those parents to inform them that it is in arrears and request that it is cleared. Whilst we accept, under the current arrangements, that students may slip into arrears because they don't have sufficient funds on the day, there are some that are very regularly in arrears. In order to try to reduce this, we are preparing to write to families where this is an issue to request that they top up their child(rens) account each weekend and identify a daily spend limit, so that the amount cannot be breached. We hope this will help families to enable their child(ren) to budget more easily.

Please note, we can put daily limits on student spend or we can stop children using the canteen completely if meals and snacks are provided from home instead.

VACANCIES SCHOOL MEALS SUPERVISORY ASSISTANT (SMSA)

St. Bede's Catholic College has a vacancy for a School Meals Supervisory Assistant to supervise, guide and assist pupils during the midday break, to ensure the safety, general welfare and proper conduct of pupils during this period.

The usual hours of work are 12.15pm – 1.30pm Monday to Friday, term time only and there is the opportunity of a free school meal or a drink.

St Bede's is a Real Living Wage employer for which the hourly rate is currently $\pounds 12.45$ (increasing to $\pounds 12.60$ in April 2025) Actual annual salary is currently $\pounds 3,471$.

All posts at St Bede's are subject to a 6-month probationary period.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a Disclosure and Barring Service Check before starting work.


